

WALK SAFE!



- At signals, obey the law and wait for the “Walk” signal.
- At intersections without signals, wait for a gap in traffic. Do not step out into traffic and assume vehicles will stop.
- You may cross mid-block between two intersections where no signals are present, but you must yield to traffic.
- It is illegal to cross mid-block between two intersections that have signals.
- You may cross at the intersection of any two streets whether a crosswalk is marked or not, unless there are signs prohibiting crossing.
- Be alert and visible to motorists, even if you are crossing legally, motorists may not see you.

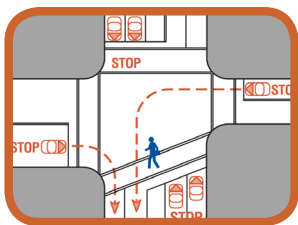

SHARE THE ROAD

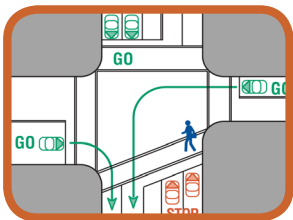
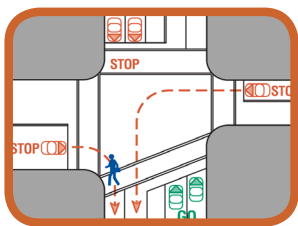


- Vehicles must stop for pedestrians in all crosswalks.
- Crosswalks exist at every intersection whether they are marked or not.
- When turning, you may be focused on oncoming traffic. Pay special attention to any pedestrians that might be crossing your path.
- When traveling on a multi-lane road and the vehicles in the lane next to you slow or stop, there may be a pedestrian crossing. Check the road before moving on.
- On one-way or two lane streets, motorists must stop for a pedestrian for the entire crossing of the street.
- On larger streets vehicles must stop if a pedestrian is in their half of the roadway.

- Vehicles must stop if a pedestrian is within one lane of their half of the roadway.



- Once the pedestrian is beyond one lane of their half of the roadway, vehicles may go.
